UPCOMING EVENTS!! BE AWARE!! MARK YOUR CALENDARS

Below are some events / activities that are not normally scheduled on our church calendar. For some there are details elsewhere in this Good News Newsletter, or they will be available in the months to come. Mark your calendars so you will be aware and can participate!

August 17 – in the Sanctuary immediately following worship; an information meeting on the **Hurricane Recovery Mission Trip** to Augusta GA from October 26 to November 1. We will have printed information for you as well as answer your questions, so you will be able to know all the reasons you can participate in this Mission Trip!

August 11-19 – Plumbing repair at the church. Overhead plumbing will be installed throughout the building for everything except the bathrooms in the corridor behind the sanctuary. The important dates to note are August 18-19 when the water will be turned off for all facilities, except the bathrooms behind the Sanctuary, which are on a separate system. They will be available throughout this process.

For those of you who are new to First Presbyterian since Hurricane Milton in the fall of 2024, we opened the church (Eubank Hall) for those who did not feel safe in their own homes during the storm. Eleven of us stayed at the church and did very well. We will be doing the same again this year, if we have a hurricane.

If your information has changed or you have not completed a form, please pick one up in the Narthex or the office and complete it. Thank you for helping us as we prepare to be responsive to the congregation for the 2025 hurricane season.

On Monday, June 30, a group of 25 faithful from First Presbyterian Church gathered at the soon-to-be -dedicated facility of Family Renew Community, beautifully named The Crossing. Alongside the Mission Committee, Pastor George and other spiritually discerning hearts were welcomed by Lindsay Elliot (FRC Executive Director), Michael Martin (Board Member for The Crossing), and Dot Brooking (FRC VP of Development). Together, we came with open hands and humble hearts to seek the Lord's direction and ask how He might use this ministry to extend His Kingdom.

The Crossing stands as a powerful testimony of what God can do through willing partners in Christ. Residents referred through local churches and community organizations will undergo screenings and be part of a Christ-centered environment.
