



150th ANNIVERSARY UPDATE

150th ANNIVERSARY: THE FINAL MONTHS

As the congregation of First Presbyterian looks to the final months of 2025, we also look to the conclusion of our year of celebrating 150 years of presence in New Smyrna Beach with ministry and mission.

As the 150th Task Force gathered for the first time in the spring of 2024, we prayed prayers of praise and thanksgiving for God's presence and faithfulness through these last 150 years, as well as asking for guidance and care as we made decisions and focused on our celebration and our future.

Each month of this year has brought events, activities, and financial donations to organizations which serve people in our community. These final months are the same. Even as we celebrate for ourselves, we reach out and focus on others. Join us over these next months in our activities and events, for these final three months continue to bring a flurry of activity:

- * A Musical Potpourri. This concert is our musical gift to the community on Sunday, October 5 at 3:00 in the sanctuary, followed by a reception in Eubank Hall
- * Acknowledging and thanking each of the seventy-five Advent Health Auxiliary Volunteers with a small gift bag and personal thank you note.
- * The Presbyterian Women financial gifts of \$150 each to Beacon House (domestic abuse), Red, White, and Blue (a veteran's organization), and the New Smyrna Beach Police Department for their Christmas "Shop with a Cop" program for children.

- * The Mission Committee is funding the renovation / upgrading of the nursery
- * The Property Management Committee is installing new lights in the breezeway behind the sanctuary
- * To share our enjoyment of food and fellowship, we are creating a 150th Anniversary cookbook with delicious and fun recipes.
- * We are hosting the December meeting of Central Florida Presbytery on December 2. It will be a full day of commissioners from each Presbyterian Church in central Florida being here for worship, discussion, business, and, of course, a homemade lunch from our Fellowship Committee! It is an open meeting, and everyone is invited and welcome to sit in on any portion to see what presbytery is all about.
- * Bringing us "full circle" from last December, we will be participating in the New Smyrna Beach Christmas Parade, as we did last year to introduce our 150th celebration. This year we will be highlighting our Bike Ministry by riding bicycles in the parade. More details to come.

We conclude our year as we began, with a portion of our foundational scripture, Psalm 150. "Praise the Lord. Praise God in his sanctuary; praise him in his mighty heavens. Praise him for his acts of power; praise him for his surpassing greatness…Let everything that has breath praise the Lord. Praise the Lord."





SAFETY AND SECURITY

First Presbyterian Church strongly feels that the safety of its congregants and it's employees is critical to a wellfunctioning church. To this end, over the last several months, significant safety and security enhancements have been made to the First Presbyterian property.

The most noticeable enhancement is the new lighting that has been installed in the tunnel behind the sanctuary. The old incandescent lights have been replaced with three LED lights. The LED lights provide 50% more light while using 70% less energy than the old incandescent bulbs. These lights are on 24 hours a day to provide improved security for those using the building after dark.

For those working in the church office, a new ninecamera video system has been installed, providing clear, real-time video of all entrances to the Education building. Additionally, a new remote locking feature has been installed, allowing the office door to be electronically locked from the inside.

During the Sunday service, a Safety and Security team member is stationed at the back of the sanctuary. This team member is responsible for two primary duties: providing assistance in the event of an emergency during the service and monitoring the cameras that deliver live video of the exterior areas surrounding the sanctuary. The church has added four new cameras and repositioned the four existing cameras to enhance these exterior views

Take as many boxes as provide personal care items for students at New Smyrna you feel led to fill, or contribute financially so our women may fill them on your behalf. 
